Climping Beach Update – October Spring Tides - Environment Agency

The spring tides this week are the second highest of the year, the levels of the tides across the weekend are similar to those seen on Thursday but Sunday's lunchtime tide will be accompanied with Force 7 southerly winds. A flood alert is in place for Climping Beach, and this is likely to be upgraded to a flood warning for the Sunday tide.

During the high tides water is likely over wash the beach towards Bread Lane. The water will get into the ditch network and travel into the Ryebank Rife and out of the River Arun. There may also be impacts to the shingle banks over the weekend.

We undertook shingle recycling work in May which bolstered the bunds by 1800 tonnes. There is additional shingle available on site and we will have a bulldozer available next week which can be used to restore any damage to the shingle banks caused by the storm. We will be monitoring the beach over the high tides and will undertake incident response activities if required.
